


Too much speaking at Rabka

24 people from 8 different countries have come to Rabka-Zdroj for a training course called **Communica8** as part of Erasmus+ programme. They came from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Lithuania, Republic of Macedonia, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia and, of course, from Poland. The training started on 10 September and it's going to end on 17 September.

Course was organized by polish NGO called SMIT „CREATOR“. Main aim of the course is to focus on different aspects of communication and to show its importance in future employment and youth work. Starting from the simplest human communication and its varieties as verbal and non-verbal, computer mediated communication, through social and marketing communication up to cross-cultural. Course will also help participants to realise how important communication is in order to disseminate and exploit the results of their projects. The trainers use non-formal education to show to participants significance of dialogue on each level of their life, starting with their closest people, but also during job interviews and formal meeting, projects management and implementation as well as on intercultural European level.
